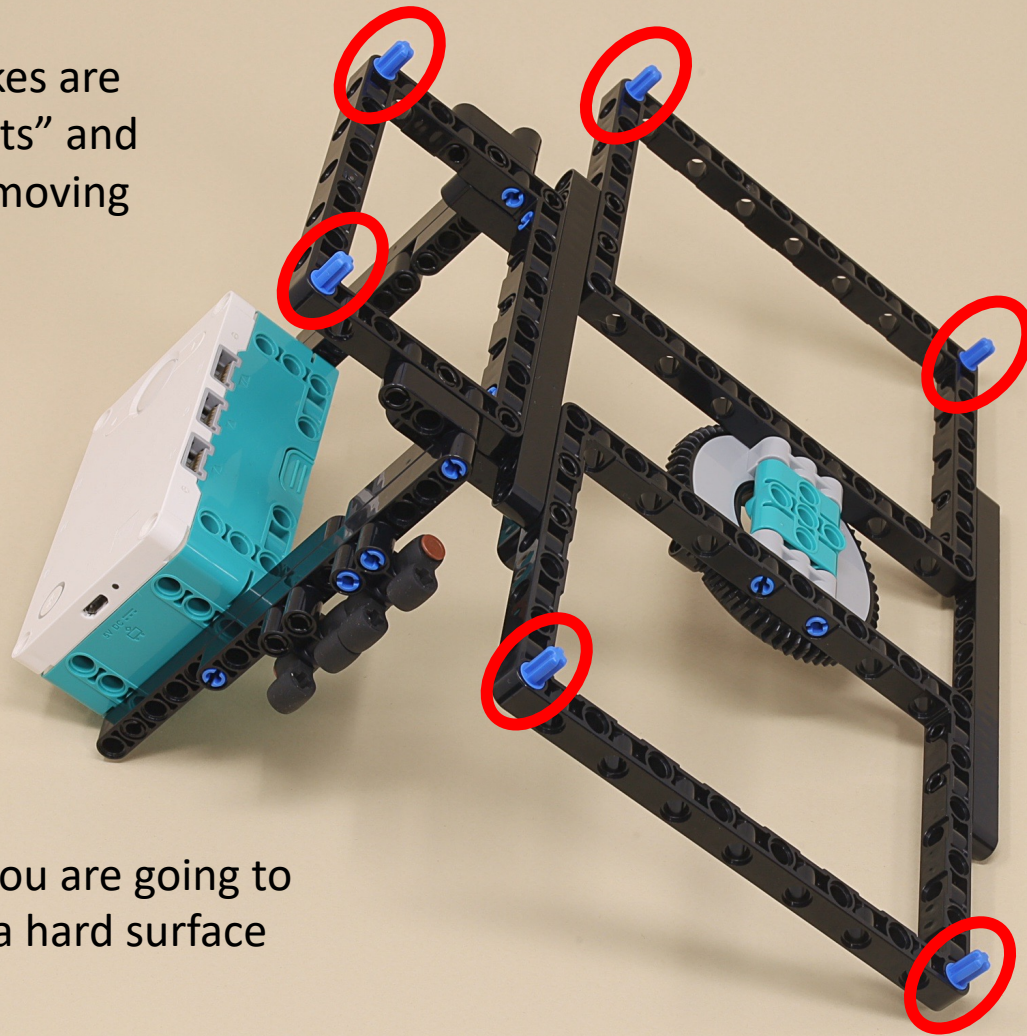








These carpet spikes are the batter's "cleats" and will help it from moving while swinging.
